TODAY'S GOSPEL

*He sat down opposite the treasury and observed
how the crowd put money into the treasury.*

Many rich people put in large sums.

*A poor widow also came and put in two small coins
worth a few cents.*

*Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them,
"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more
than all the other contributors to the treasury.*

*For they have all contributed from their
surplus wealth,
but she, from her poverty, has contributed all
she had, her whole livelihood."*

Mark 12:41-44



Last week's readings were about how we should love God with our whole selves, and love one another as ourselves. This week, the theme is expanded and made more concrete as it speaks directly to our response to those experiencing material need. Our first reading is a story about Elijah, the greatest prophet in Hebrew tradition, who was in exile and danger from King Ahab and his pagan wife, Jezebel. There was a three year drought at the time, brought on by Ahab's disobedience to God—he allowed Jezebel to bring idol worship with her and was wholesale slaughtering the prophets and priests of the God of Israel. The drought was a warning to straighten up and fly right. She didn't heed it and came to a bad end. But, in the meantime, everyone was suffering. Elijah asked a poor widow who was down to her last meal for herself and her son to share their food with him. She, even in her fear and poverty, did share with him. As a result, her food never ran out and she was cared for throughout the drought.

The Gospel contains a warning and an example. The warning is against those who use their position to gain honor for themselves and to take advantage of the poor to, "devour the houses

of widows." Meanwhile, a widow walked by the Temple and put a tiny bit of change into the treasury. Jesus remarks that her offering meant more than the bags of money the rich people put in because it came from her poverty, rather than her excess. This is what we are called to—to share from our poverty—whether that's poverty of material wealth, time, energy; whatever we have to offer. We trust that whatever we give, God will take care of us as he did the widow of Zarephath.

Ahab and Jezebel's actions affected the whole kingdom; by inviting evil into their worship, the whole region was plagued by drought. Do I recognize that my actions have an impact on other people, even when they seem private? The widow in the first reading shared her very last food with Elijah, trusting in God. The widow from the Gospel shared her last money with the people of God, also trusting in God. These were vulnerable women—the ones that Jewish Law said should be taken care of by the community—not the other way around. Would I be so courageous to share the last of my goods with someone who needs it?

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION: Following 9:00am Mass until 1:00pm

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism most Sundays at 1:00pm. Parents must be registered in the parish and attend a baptismal preparation session. Sponsor certificates must be presented at the time of registration for Baptism, and can be obtained by the Godparent from the parish in which they are currently registered.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must notify the Parish Office one year in advance to reserve a date and begin preparation which includes Pre-Cana. At least one party must be a registered member of the parish.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive Sacraments is called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. See bulletin for meeting details.

MINISTRY TO THE SICK: To arrange for pastoral visits and Sacraments for homebound or hospitalized parishioners, please call the Parish Office.

SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN: Children receive the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation through our Religious Education program. Children seven years old who have been Baptized or have not received their Sacraments through our program may be candidates for RCIA. Please contact the Religious Education office for more information.

REGISTER FOR THE PARISH: We are so happy to welcome new members to our Parish family! Please come and see us at the Parish Office so that we can get your information and introduce you to the many aspects of our Parish life.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: During office hours we welcome those who would like to request that their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for particularly at a weekday or weekend Mass. We ask a donation of \$10 per Mass.

OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY: Registered parishioners who have been asked to be a Godparent or Confirmation Sponsor, should call the Parish Office to request a certificate of eligibility. Eligible individuals (according to Cannon Law) are at least 16 years old, fully initiated, married in the Catholic Church (if married) and participating in the life of our faith regularly and are not the child's parents.



How Are Relics Obtained?

First class relics are pieces of a Saint, like the relics of St. Anthony which came to our Church a few weeks ago, and some of the relics of St. Pio which are coming this week. Since we are to respect the bodies of those who have died, the question of how relics are obtained is a good one! First, it's important to remember that these days it takes at least four years after an individual has died for them to become a Saint—that's plenty of time for a body to go through the natural decomposition process. So, when relics are taken from a Saint, they are taken from a pretty well decomposed body (there would be no point to taking them before they were made a saint). In the case of St. Anthony, when he died, they buried him and when he was declared a Saint, they exhumed his body to move it to Padua. When they opened his coffin, they discovered that he had decomposed normally except for his tongue and jaw—they were perfectly intact! So, they took them and enshrined them, burying the rest of his body in a smaller casket and sending him on to Padua. 800 years later, they reopened the casket and took a floating rib and a piece of his facial skin to put on display so that people who had a devotion to him to get close to a part of him. Now, the relics travel the world to bring Anthony closer to those who would like to see him. Make sure you take an opportunity to visit with the St. Pio relics this week!

RESOLUTION REGARDING THE TREE OF LIFE SYNAGOGUE TRAGEDY

WHEREAS, the Freehold Clergy Association is committed to striving for justice and peace among all people and respecting the dignity of every human being;

WHEREAS, we are blessed as an interfaith organization with members of the Jewish faith, and we are committed to loving, supporting, protecting and serving our neighbors;

WHEREAS, the unspeakable acts of brutality, hate and anti-Semitism perpetrated against the faithful and innocent congregants of the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh as they were gathered in worship on Saturday, October 27, 2018, have horrified and outraged us;

WHEREAS, in the past year, there has been a 57% increase in anti-Semitic acts and speech in this country; and

WHEREAS, we cannot be silent in the face of this evil which is infecting our land;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Freehold Clergy Association stands in solidarity with our Jewish brothers and sisters in their grief, outrage and a yearning for shalom.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That we commit ourselves to speaking out publicly against all anti-Semitic speech and acts. We commit ourselves to standing as one with our Jewish brothers and sisters and other faith congregations in eliminating the evil of anti-Semitism as we proclaim together, "Never again."
